AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE ALTERNATIVE TAX BUDGET INFORMATION OF THE CITY OF MAPLE HEIGHTS, OHIO, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2022; SUBMITTING THE SAME TO THE BUDGET COMMISSION OF CUYAHOGA COUNTY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on October 11, 2002, the Cuyahoga County Budget Commission with an affirmative vote of all members waived the requirement for taxing authorities of subdivisions or other taxing units (including schools) to adopt a Tax Budget as provided under O.R.C. Section 5705.281, but instead requires the filing of Alternative Tax Budget Information on an annual basis; and

WHEREAS, the Alternative Tax Budget Information for the City of Maple Heights, Ohio for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2022 has been prepared and presented to the Council; and

WHEREAS, after due consideration, Council deems it advisable in the interest of the Municipality to adopt the Alternative Tax Budget Information.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio that:

WHEREAS, CHP is a competitive solicitation, open to all state, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies with primary law enforcement authority; and

WHEREAS, approximately \$165.5 million dollars in funding is available for FY 2021 CHP. CHP provides funding to hire and re-hire entry level career law enforcement officers in order to preserve jobs, increase community policing capacities and support crime prevention efforts; and

WHEREAS, funding under this program may be used to do the following: Hire new officers; Rehire officers (laid off as a result of budget reductions); Rehire officers (at the time of application, currently scheduled to be laid off as a result of budget reductions); and

WHEREAS, the FY 2021 CHP funds as many positions as possible for successful applicants and provides 75 percent of the approved entry-level salaries and fringe benefits of each newly hired and/or rehired full-time officer, up to \$125,000 per officer position, over the three year (36 month) grant period, with a 25% local cash match of up to \$31,250 per officer position, unless a local match waiver is approved; and

WHEREAS, the Charter Review Commission (CRC) at its April 22, 2021 meeting recommended revising and amending Article IV of the Charter to remove the requirements that the salary of all elected officials be fixed at least one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the date set for the municipal election for the terms beginning on the next succeeding first day of January and that such salary cannot be changed during such term; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article XX, Section 2 of the Charter, Council is required to submit the CRC's recommended revisions and amendments to the qualified electors of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. There shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the City, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 2nd day of November, 2021, as prescribed by general law, the question of the amendment of the Charter of the City of Maple Heights at Article IV, so that, as amended, it shall read as follows, with the deletions struck through:

"ARTICLE IV – SALARIES

The Council shall have the power to fix the salaries of all employees of the Municipality whether elected or appointed. The salaries of all elected officials shall be fixed at least one hundred twenty (120) days prior to the date set for the Municipal election for the terms beginning on the next succeeding first day of January, and shall not thereafter be changed in respect to any such term or terms or any part thereof. WHEREAS, pursuant to Article XX, Section 2 of the Charter, Council is required to submit the CRC's recommended revisions and amendments to the qualified electors of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Maple Heights, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. There shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of the City, at the general election to be held on Tuesday, the 2nd day of November, 2021, as prescribed by general law, the question of the amendment of the Charter of the City of Maple Heights at Article V, Section 8 and Article III, Section 4, so that, as amended, they shall read as follows, with the additions being underlined and the deletions struck through:

"ARTICLE III, SECTION 4. ACTIVITIES RESTRICTED; CONFLICT OF INTEREST.

The Mayor and the President of Council shall be allowed to serve on any federal, state, regional or metropolitan board or committees thereof.

The Mayor shall hold no other public employment. The Mayor may hold private employment which does not conflict with the duties of Mayor. Councilpersons may hold non-elected public employment outside the City of Maple Heights which does not conflict with Council duties. No elective officer shall be interested in the profits or emoluments of any contract, work or service for the Municipality."

"ARTICLE V, SECTION 8. LOCATION OF OFFICE.

The Mayor shall have an office at the City Hall. and, effective the first day in January of the new term, shall hold no other public or private employment."

Section 2. The Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County be, and it is hereby, directed to provide for the voting upon said Amendments and the ballots for said election shall, at the top thereof, be entitled "Proposed Charter Amendment City of Maple Heights", and the question to be submitted on said ballot shall be substantially in the following words:
