

City of Maple Heights Weekly Service and Bulk Limits

Weekly trash limit is one full cart and no more than 2, 30 gallon bags or cans of trash.

All recycling is to be in cart.

Break down cardboard before placing it in your cart.

Bulk Limit is no more than 2 bulk items.

See list of acceptable items on the back.

Bulk pickup must be scheduled in advance.

Acceptable Bulk Items

- **Appliances** – Door and freon removed.
- **TV** – 42 inches and up.
- **Bathtubs** - No larger than 4-foot sections.
- **Bed Frames** - If upholstered, must be wrapped in plastic and sealed with duct tape.
- **Cabinets** – Each cabinet counts as one bulk item.
- **Carpet/Padding** – Must be rolled and tied into 4-foot bundles. Not to exceed 50 lbs. (Four bundles equal one bulk item).
- **Indoor Furniture** - If upholstered, must be wrapped in plastic and sealed with duct tape. (Two dining chairs equal one bulk item).
- **Lumber** – Bundled and tied. No longer than 3 ft and 40 lbs.
- **Mattress/Box Spring** - Must be wrapped in plastic and sealed with duct tape or placed in a mattress bag.
- **Paint Cans/Containers** – 2 to 3 cans. All paint must be solidified and dried using an absorbent material such as sand or kitty litter.
- **Shower Enclosures** - No heavier than 50-lb sections.
- **Storm Doors** - Must have glass removed. Glass must be placed in cardboard, taped well, and marked broken glass.
- **Toilets** - Must be empty, tank must be detached from bowl.
- **Windows** - Must have glass removed. Glass must be placed in cardboard, taped well, and marked broken glass. Must be less than 50 lbs. of glass per window.

Unacceptable Bulk Items

The following items are not acceptable for curbside disposal.

- Automotive Parts/Products
- Mercury Containing Items – Fluorescent tubes, thermometers, and thermostats.
- Batteries
- Riding Lawn Mowers
- Roofing Shingles
- Tires
- Tree Stumps
- Washers/Dryers
- Hazardous Waste - Household cleaners, garden chemicals, propane tanks, sharps, needles, and lancets
